President's Message

A New Species of Waterfowl Nesting in CT?

In early June I volunteered my boat and time to help conduct a portion of the Connecticut Colonial Bird Survey in eastern Connecticut. This survey has been conducted every three years since 1978 and covers the entire Connecticut coast. Species such as terns, plovers, herons, oystercatchers, gulls and cormorants are surveyed. Tallies are taken on the number of birds and nests that are seen.

Unfortunately, due to staff reductions, the DEEP Wildlife Division (WD) was not going to be able to conduct the survey this year. Retired WD Wildlife Biologist, Julie Victoria, stepped up to the plate and assembled and coordinated a group of volunteers to get the job done! Long-term data sets on species' population status are critical to wildlife management.

Case in point, is that we saw 60 Common Eider from Stonington to New London! None were seen on the survey three years ago! All the Eider we saw were sub-adult non-breeders, except for four adults and we did not see any nests or broods. The presence of Eiders in eastern Connecticut in the summer may be "old news" to those of you who fish or boat there. If you are in those areas this summer, keep an eye out around rocky islands. Look for Eiders on a nest or a hen with a brood of young birds. If you see any, please take a photo and send it to DEEP!

Eiders may well be breeding in Connecticut now; it just needs to be verified. If they are not currently here, odds are they will be soon. Nesting Eiders have been documented at the Dumpling Islands in Long Island Sound in New York, a couple of stone throws from the Connecticut line.

Let's hope we can soon add this awesome species as a part of Connecticut's breeding waterfowl fauna!

The project was a cooperative effort among the CT DEEP Wildlife Division, CWA and Delta and will restore water to a six-acre area.

The project entailed installing a water control structure that will flood the area and allow water levels to be managed to optimize the growth of aquatic vegetation to benefit waterfowl and other water-dependent wildlife. CWA and Delta purchased and split the cost of the water control structure and sign. The DEEP Wildlife Division's Wetlands Habitat Management installed the structure. Such cooperative efforts facilitate the improvement of Connecticut's wetlands.

The 2019 contest judging was held on March 22, 2019 at Cabela's in East Hartford. The winning image featured a pair of flying Blue-winged Teal painted by Sophie Archer. Sophie's painting was the overall contest winner and the best in the Group 3 grades 7-9.

Since its inception in 1989, the Connecticut Waterfowl Association (CWA) has coordinated the Connecticut Junior Duck Stamp Art (CT JRDS) Contest in Connecticut. The CT JRDS uses a science-based art curriculum to educate students from kindergarten to high school about
